Consider the IPRF golf outing, which sold out in days and brought in more than \$20,000 in sponsorships, or the silent auction at the IAPD/IPRA Soaring to New Heights Conference, and the director's holiday lunch raffle, which together raised over \$10,000 in donations.

Notably, 2024 saw scholarship requests surpass the forecasted budget for the first time, a clear indication that efforts to raise awareness about IPRF's available resources are making an impact. Additionally, Tracey Crawford spearheaded IPRF's strategic development plan initiative. As IPRF moves forward, the trustees have placed a strong emphasis on aligning the foundation's support with IPRA's goals, optimizing resource allocation, addressing staff and volunteer needs, and identifying strategies to elevate IPRF's fundraising efforts to the next level.

It's an exciting time to envision IPRF's future, building on its accomplishments to further support IPRA and its members. To this end, in 2024, I encouraged IPRF trustees and committee members to embrace the challenge of doing "one more in '24" for IPRF. This could mean securing one more sponsorship for the golf outing, contributing one more basket for the silent auction, making one more personal donation, or dedicating one more hour to help strengthen our community.
